## Campus and Infrastructure

## Moot Court Exercises

Law as a profession is becoming an ideal choice for many youngsters and at GLS Law College special emphasis is laid on developing the requisite core skills

- Ample importance is given to moot courts / mock trials / client negotiations etc., which are very important in moulding the analytical and argumentative skills of the budding lawyers.
- Knowledge, memory and drafting are the core skills that all law graduates must have – which is the key component in teaching and training the law students.
- A lawyer must also be able to think quickly and logically and should have tremendous perseverance.
- Moot court sessions are conducted on regular basis to get the students familiar with the procedure and functioning of the courts
- Acquainting the students with mooting techniques, dress code, drafting and preparing the memorials
- Developing the skill of oral advocacy, overcome fear of public speaking, enhance stage presentation
- Students represent the college at various national and international moot court competition hosted by national law school and law colleges of India.



## National Moot Court Competition

Every year GLS Law College organizes Shri I.M. Nanavati Memorial National Moot Court Competition to commemorate late Shri I.M. Nanavati who has made his mark as an advocate and educationalist. GLS Law College organized and hosted Shri I.M. Nanavati Memorial National Moot Court Competition between January 19th to 21st, 2017. All total 32 teams from 15 states of India comprising of 96 budding lawyers from various National Law Universities and eminent law colleges had participated in this competition.

The preliminary and quarter final round were judged by eminent and well-experienced advocates practicing in the high court of Gujarat. The semi-final round was judged by the designated senior advocates of High Court of Gujarat and the final round was judged by Hon'ble Mr. Justice Akil Kureshi, Judge High Court of Gujarat and Hon'ble Ms. Justice H.N. Devani, Judge High Court of Gujarat. This indeed presented a golden opportunity for budding lawyers across India to present themselves and get guided by such eminent personalities before the beginning of their professional careers.

With this endeavour, GLS Law College signed MoU with Gujarat Pollution Control Board, a statutory body that has been over the years entrusted with the Central Acts and relevant Rules for pollution control, aimed at developing all round capabilities to protect the environment by effective law enforcement and by adopting best environmental management practices to keep the State on course of sustainable development.
